FROM OUR PASTOR

January 29



The spiritual health of a parish can be gauged by several things. One thing is Mass attendance, and Cathedral's Mass attendance is booming! Last Sunday, at the 11:00 Sunday Mass, something very unusual happened: we ran out of the Body of Christ during Communion! Does this mean that someone failed to put enough hosts in the ciboria? Hardly.

Sunday by Sunday we have had to slightly increase the number of hosts we put out before Mass—usually around 500. We also have the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the Tabernacle meaning there is usually around 800 consecrated hosts available at the 11:00 Mass. Last Sunday there was not a seat to be had and attendees lined the walls. (The church seats just shy of 900.)

The good news for attendees was that the Precious Blood was still available. Few of us usually take note that Christ is just as fully present—body, soul, and divinity—in the Precious Blood as in the Body of Christ. While a few were a little upset that that we ran out of the Body of Christ, it became an opportune moment to remind ourselves of what we believe about the Body & Blood of Christ.

We are seeing the same trend of increasing attendance at all the Masses (although the 5:00 Saturday Mass is up and down depending on social schedules and family activities).

Another sign of spiritual health is in the number of people coming to Confession on Saturdays. In the past, there was a trickle of penitents at 3:00 with some breaks between individual confessions, and there was at times a rush at the end as people try to time going to confession and the beginning of Mass. For the past many weeks, there so many have come to the Sacrament that there are no breaks and the priest is lucky to finish Confessions in time to say his prayers before Mass! Each Saturday is starting to become a mini-penance service. This is simply fantastic.

Clearly, the Holy Spirit is moving among us. Let us rejoice and be glad!

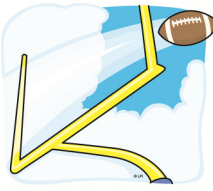

END OF SERIES ON ISLAM

This Sunday: Father Bruce Morrill, S.J., the Edward A. Malloy Professor of Catholic Studies at Vanderbilt Divinity School, presents *The Church and Other Religions: Doctrine and Prayer*. Fr. Morrill will review the contemporary teaching on the Church's relationship to other religions, especially Islam, along with some attention to contemporary theologians. He will review the Church's prayer on Good Friday, namely, the ten great intercessions, which move in concentric circles from the Roman Catholic Church to all Christians, to the Jews, to all who believe in God, to those who do not believe in God.

NEW SERIES BEGINS NEXT SUNDAY

American cultures wars notwithstanding, Science and Religion coexist quite well within the Catholic Church. Speaking before the Pontifical Academy of Sciences, Pope Benedict XVI has said "Christianity does not posit an inevitable conflict between supernatural faith and scientific progress," (2010) and science can be "a place of dialogue, a meeting between man and nature, and potentially, even between man and his Creator." (2006)

Please join us during the Sundays of February as we examine the roles of Science and Medicine and hear how faithful Catholics pursue their scientific vocations. This four week series will provide a basic orientation to current scientific and religious perspectives in preparation for a special public lecture on Wed., February 29, 2012 presented by Maureen Condic, PhD, on "*Stem Cell Research and Ethics*."

February 5: "What is Science?" presented by Bob Scherrer, parishioner of Assumption Church in Nashville and Chairperson of the Department of Physics and Astronomy, Vanderbilt University. Dr. Scherrer writes, "I will examine the nature of science: how it works, and what it does. What are the assumptions or "axioms" of science? How are scientific theories constructed? What areas are inside and which are outside the domain of science? Why is science so successful inside its domain of activity? Can science say anything about morality? Does it have anything to say about the existence of God?"

February 12: "Becoming a Physician - Entering into the Mystery of Medicine" a personal reflection presented by Cathedral parishioner Denis O'Day MD. Dr. O'Day writes that his reflection "will deal with the interface between science and faith, secular vs. sacred and Medicine as a vocation." Dr. O'Day is Director of the Emphasis Program and Professor of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences, Vanderbilt University School of Medicine.

February 19: "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship. The Stem Cell Debate: Fact and Fiction" presented by parishioner, Joey Barnett, PhD. Dr. Barnett is Vice Chair, Pharmacology and Professor of Pharmacology, Medicine, Pediatrics, and Pathology, Microbiology & Immunology at Vanderbilt University Medical Center. Dr. Barnett will present the science and vocabulary behind stem cell research efforts with the goal of providing the tools needed by nonscientists to understand and participate in the debate about this important issue.

February 26: "Healing and Curing: The Intersection of Faith and Medicine" presented by Fr. Bruce Morrill, SJ. Father Morrill will speak on the distinction between curing and healing, between scientific treatment of disease and holistic care of illness.

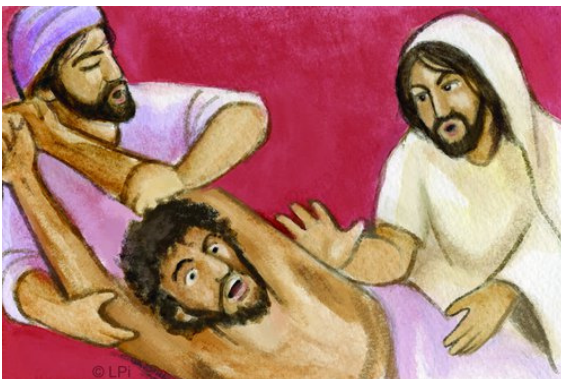

THEOLOGY ON TAP RETURNS!

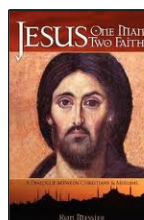
